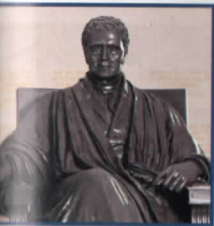

Exhibits highlighting the Court's history are located throughout the ground floor. Also on view are select portraits of the Justices.



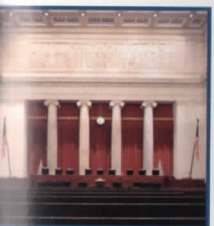
## JOHN MARSHALL STATUE

This ground floor landmark pays tribute to the nation's longest serving Chief Justice, who served for 34 years from 1801–1835.



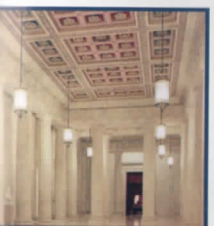
## SPIRAL STAIRCASES

Situated at the center of the first floor, the Justices meet in the Courtroom to hear oral argument and announce decisions.



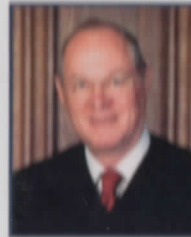
## GREAT HALL

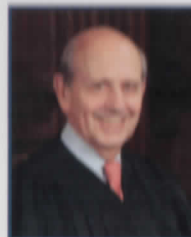

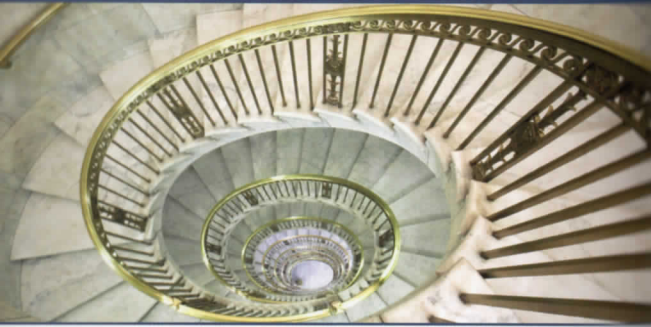

*The Supreme Court of the United States*



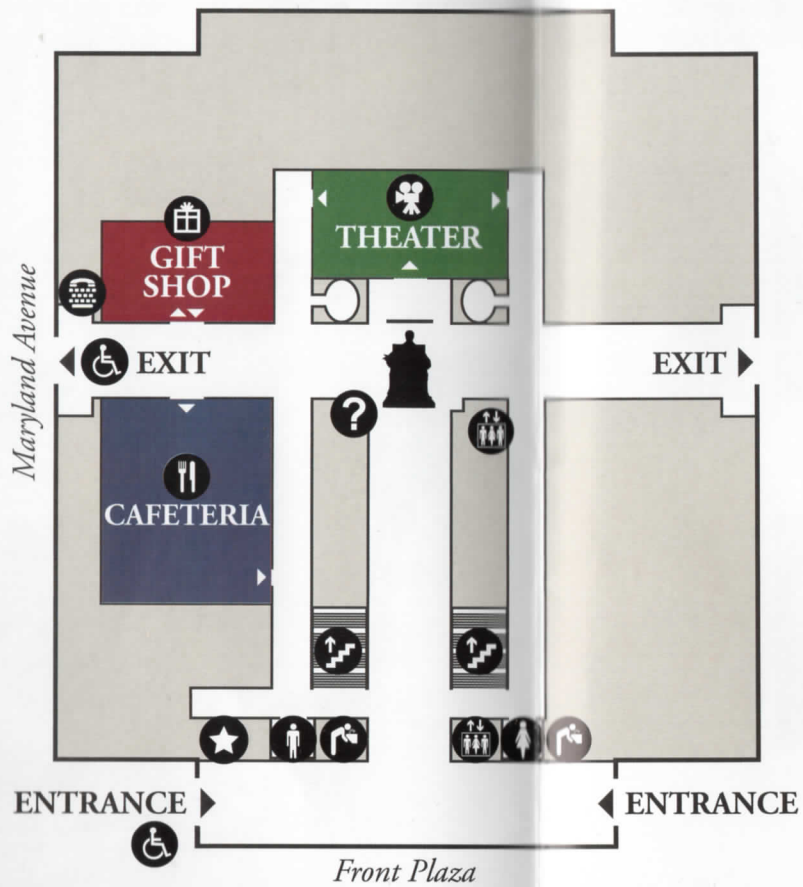
